HOW TO RAISE A MONARCH BUTTERFLY FROM EGG OR CATERPILLAR In the wild, only about 2 to 8 butterflies will survive from 100 eggs (a Monarch female butterfly can lay up to 400 eggs) There are many predators (insects, rodents) and dangers (weather, people, habitat loss), and by raising Monarch butterflies you are helping the butterfly population

often they protect the butterflies against enemies. Some colors help conceal butterflies; other patterns may be a warning to would-be predators that the butterfly is distasteful, or in the case of the monarch, poisonous. Carotenoids in milkweed (*Asclepias currasavica*), the primary host plant for monarch butterflies, are poisonous.
